# SPECIAL BANDSMAN REPORT

## Many Ways to Support a Fellow Bandsman...

Deanna Bean was diagnosed with anaplastic large cell lymphoma on 11/15/02. She had a tumor behind and in her left ear as well as bad cells in the lymph nodes on her neck. She has been undergoing chemotherapy since 11/16/02 and will continue receiving treatments into April. She is 26 years old. Deanna's prognosis is good. This cancer is very aggressive which means it grows quickly, which means it should be especially reactive to the chemotherapy. Within days of her first treatment, the size of the tumor visibly reduced. She doesn't feel the level of pain she did in November however, she is experiencing the side effects of chemotherapy. Deanna was living in San Diego when she was diagnosed but by Christmas time decided it would be best to relocate to Sacramento where she is closer to friends and family. She has been too sick to work and so is on a medical leave from her position as a buyer at a company in San Diego. Deanna does have insur-

ance, but as Dr. Penny Westney says, "Cancer is EXPENSIVE!" An account has been established at Washington Mutual to receive donations to help Deanna with the bills. Here's what you need to do if you'd like to contribute:

- write out a check to "FBO Deanna Bean" (FBO means "for benefit of")
- go to your local Washington Mutual branch location
- ask to deposit this check into the Benefit account for Deanna Bean. **(You will need the account number, email [caamb@Camb.ucdavis.edu](mailto:caamb@Camb.ucdavis.edu) for the number.)**
- you will be asked for your name and address which will be sent with the receipt to Katie Gordon who is managing the account (this assists in accounting as well as enabling thank-you's to be sent).

Deanna appreciates all of the support she has received from her band friends. Six months is a long time to have your life on hold, so please continue to send cards, call, and visit. Katie Gordon is managing an email distribution list and sending out updates on Deanna's status.

When I heard about her diagnosis, my first thought was "What can I do for Deanna?" Of course, there's a million answers to that question. Here's the answer that I came up with: I've decided to run a marathon with Team in Training, a fundraising group for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. Many people think I'm crazy, but for me it's a way to help Deanna and other people fighting lymphoma. By committing to run this marathon, I've also committed to raising \$2400 for The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. LLS is a group that raises money for blood cancer research, as well as helps patients fighting the disease. About 80% of the money that I raise will

go directly to research and patient care. Deanna was excited when I told her about running with Team in Training, not only because she too wants to run a marathon, but because they've already helped her out in a couple of ways. LLS has a great web-site with tons of information, and they also matched Deanna up with another patient with the same type of cancer, so she can talk to someone who knows what she's going through.

I'll send you a receipt so you have proof of your generous donation for the tax-man. There is a deadline for my fundraising, so please try to get in your donations ASAP.

For those of you who have heard from me already, and sent in your donations, I cannot thank you enough! Every day when I check my mailbox and see another envelope from one of you, I get so excited. The support that I am getting is amazing.

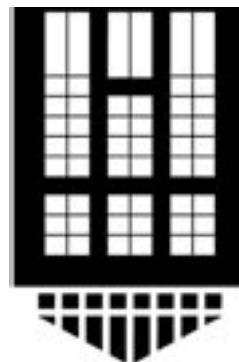
